

Objective: In reference to Education Code Section 41580 – College Readiness Block Grant, the following plan describes how the funds received will increase or improve services for unduplicated pupils to ensure college readiness.

College Readiness Block Grant Plan

Millennium High School administration and staff provide college readiness to pupils in various ways in each grade level.

Program	Description	Grade Level	Estimated Cost
Career Choices Curriculum	Course materials such as the online account and workbooks allows students to track their career and college goals and progress through building a comprehensive 10-year plan beginning in 9 th grade.	9 th	\$2,000
College Field Trips	Students attend structured campus tours. Transportation provided by a chartered bus to visit colleges and trade schools and learn about post-secondary programs/opportunities. Two field trips per semester.	10 th – 12 th	\$7,500
Annual Counseling Review	Staffing salary totaling 90 hours of individual learning plan appointments with students and parents. Academic progress, course scheduling, and goals for high school graduation and beyond are discussed.	10 th	\$22,000
School of Etiquette and Decorum Series	Included in the Career Education course to provide professional etiquette training. Develops business communication while preparing students for jobs, scholarship, and college interviews.	11 th	\$4,000

PSAT 8/9 Exam	College Board PSAT 8/9 Preliminary college preparation exam to determine college readiness.	7 th – 9 th	\$1,350
College Bound Club	Annual scholarship of completion for participation in monthly club discussing college readiness topics and resources to promote success in high school and for post-secondary education goals.	9 th	\$4,000
Naviance Online Program	Annual online subscription which provides College and Career Readiness search tools, assessments, lesson plans, parent guidance, and college planning to all 9 th through 12 th grade students. This includes start up administration costs and staff training for use of program.	9 th – 12 th	\$13,000
College Early Start	Allows students to take courses at the local junior college receiving college credits in addition to high school elective credits. Students who successfully pass this rigorous course of study will be reimbursed the cost of college tuition per credit. Each course is currently at \$46 per unit averaging three units per course.	10 th – 12 th	\$21,150
